RESOLUTION NO. 20-14

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ON ALL TOWNSHIP MAINTAINED ROADS IN PLEASANT TOWNSHIP, BUTLER COUNTY, KANSAS

- WHEREAS, public roads within the political boundaries of Pleasant Township that are within the unincorporated area of Butler County, Kansas and not maintained by Butler County, Kansas are local roads under Pleasant Township maintenance jurisdiction; and,
- WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Butler County is the designated Local Public Authority for adopting regulatory signs within the unincorporated areas of Butler County, Kansas; and,
- WHEREAS, the Board of Township Officers of Pleasant Township has submitted a request to Butler County to have all main line roads maintained by Pleasant Township be posted for a maximum speed limit of 35 mph and to have all other roads maintained by Pleasant Township that are primarily used for residential access be posted for a maximum speed limit of 30 mph.
- NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Butler County, Kansas as follows:
- SECTION 1. The maximum rate of speed permitted for motor vehicle traffic on all local main line roads maintained by Pleasant Township shall be 35 miles per hour.
- SECTION 2. The maximum rate of speed permitted for motor vehicle traffic on all other local roads maintained by Pleasant Township that are primarily used for residential access shall be 30 miles per hour.
- SECTION 3. The speed limits established herein have been established pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 8-1560 and the violation of the speed limitation contained herein shall be punishable as with other traffic infractions established under the Uniform Act Regulating Traffic; Rules Of The Road.
- SECTION 4. The maximum rates of speed established herein shall supersede all other maximum rates of speed previously established on Pleasant Township maintained roads.
- SECTION 5. The Board of Township Officers of Pleasant Township shall install and forever maintain speed limit signs for said local roads in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, latest edition.
- SECTION 6. This Resolution shall take effect upon its passage and publication in the official County newspaper and upon placement of appropriate signs identifying the foregoing speed zone.
